



**Memorandum of Understanding
Between**

**Des Moines Area Community College
And
Grand View University**


The Des Moines Area Community College Honors Program and Grand View University Honors Program have agreed to offer DMACC Honors graduates a pathway to Grand View University's Honors Program. This Memorandum of Understanding is intended to establish specifics of student transition from the Honors Program at DMACC to the Honors Program at Grand View University. Conceived as a continuing relationship, the agreement will be reviewed regularly to assure that all parties are sufficiently benefitting from this relationship. Both parties commit to an in-depth review of the agreement in the case of major curriculum changes by either institution.


Grand View University commits to accepting DMACC Honors graduates with the following articulations:


1. A student who graduates from the DMACC Honors Program may transfer to Grand View University as a member of Grand View University's Honors Program as long as the other University transfer requirements are satisfied.
2. Notification of a student's intent to join Grand View University's Honors Program should be provided by the student in the semester prior to admission at Grand View University.
3. Students completing HON 100 and HON 200 at DMACC will have met LIBA200H at Grand View University.
4. Students completing HON 100 and HON 200 at DMACC will have met LIBA160H at Grand View University.


Student's remaining hours at Grand View University to Graduate with Honors are as follows:


LIBA300H Core Seminar II (Honors II: Society and Global Citizenship)	4 credits
